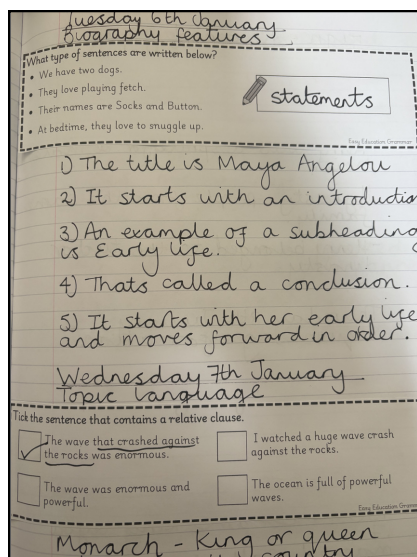


Getting Started

Easy Education Grammar is designed to fit easily alongside your existing English provision. Getting started is simple and flexible.

Step 1: Choose your daily starters

Use the standard daily recap starters for children accessing the current year group curriculum. If children are still mastering sentence structure and basic punctuation, use the Back to Basics versions.

Example 1 shows two Year 5 Daily Recaps, combining retrieval of previously taught grammar with current year group objectives.

Example 2 shows a Year 2 Back to Basics activity, focusing on sentence structure and punctuation.

Step 2: Establish your weekly routine

Alongside the Daily Recap, use the weekly activities to revisit key grammar areas in different ways.

Mend It Monday: Pupils identify, correct and explain errors in sentences. The main focus is on the correct use of punctuation.

Tense Tuesday: Regular retrieval of year-appropriate tense knowledge.

Word Wednesday: Regular retrieval to build a secure understanding of word classes.

Weekly Focus: An optional, more formal check of previously taught grammar.

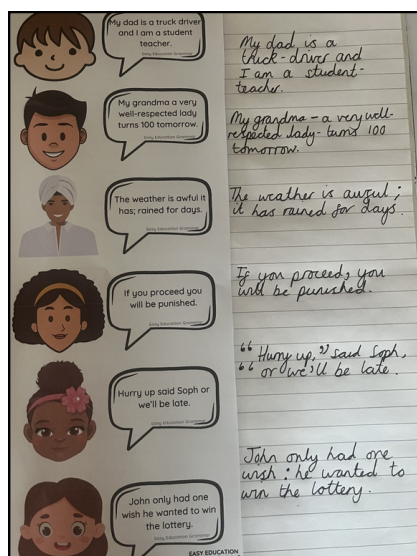
Choose the activities that best suit your class or school and decide where they fit within your existing timetable. **These activities are designed to take no longer than 10 minutes.**

Going Forward

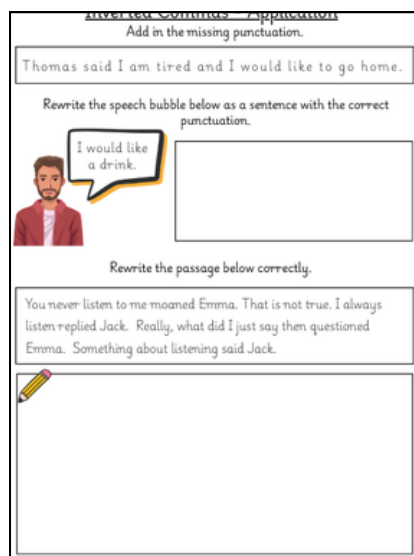
Once your retrieval routine is established, use the wider Easy Education Grammar resources to revisit objectives that need more practice.

Respond to pupil need:

Continue core grammar teaching
